 Guest Speaker to join us for lunch walk. DNRC Service Foresters, Rick Moore and Dave Jones, will offer a short course on 2 active forest pests that are currently wreaking havoc on several species of trees in Montana: Mountain pine beetle and spruce budworm. Attendees will learn the lifecycle of these critters and how they spread. Also, the size and scope of this current epidemic and what Montanans might expect to see in the future.
