4-H Vehicle License Plates

Have you noticed vehicles driving around with a 4-H specialty license plate on them? There are some, but if you haven't seen any this is an awareness notice to let you know, 4-H Specialty License Plates exist and they are available for anyone in Montana, the 4-H plate requires an administration and production fee to the county and a \$20 yearly fee. The \$20 yearly fee goes entirely to the 4-H program. The 4-H plate has been available in Montana since 2002 but many people do not know they exist. Those of you who are interested in supporting the 4-H program and would like to have the 4-H license plate on your vehicle, remember to purchase one the next time you relicense your vehicle.

Ambassador report (Jayden Cook).

- Masquerade Dance in December was a success for 4-H members and community folks.
- Blood drive was cancelled, will be rescheduled.

Rec Lab

- April 19-21 in Boulder. Six members and Leader Linda Cook are registered.
- Members pay one half of registration total (\$100).
- Karen moved that Council pay the second half of member registrations, as well as one half of the cost of a rental car. Linda seconded, motion carried.

Communication Days

- Enthusiasm from members. Two members participated in StirUps, one in Favorite Foods.

- A point of service (POS) system for cashiers is being researched.

- Council pays \$45 of registration cost for each member participating in Communication Days,

Meeting called to order at 6:30 pm

Minutes from October Meeting: Approved

Treasurer's Report: Balance \$7,437.51 (does not include livestock sales fee yet)

Old Business:

Fair Improvements:

- Ryan and Bethany are working on the Jason Hanna sign.
- Raelyn & Carissa will look at the gates and lattice that need repaired in the sheep barn.
- Doug/Whitney hope to do some updates in the Rabbit/Poultry Barn. (Plywood walls, roof, new poultry pen supplies)
- Seal horse tie rails.
- New tin on swine barn. Taylor Construction bid \$11,000 to replace roofing and rotten boards underneath, rotten post and facing board. John Thurston bid \$10,250. Mahlon Lee bid approx. \$18,000 not to include any board replacement. Dallas Bender bid \$7500 plus \$10/8' length boards needed. Fair board might want to use old tin on the Pavilion walls. Juli will request grant funds for this project from AgWest.
- The fair board has aluminum bleachers above the grand stands we could use at the show arena. They would like to use the ones we have as well. The new ones would need railing installed. Juli is getting a price on the railing. Do we want more bleachers around the show arena? Maybe look into sponsor banners for the bleachers.
- Horse wash rack Pat is getting bids/details lined out and will work with horse leaders on design. Permitting paperwork is finished. This will be a spring project with Pardee Excavation.
- Work with fairboard on horse barn wood panel repairs and painting. Juli will get a bid from John Thurston.
- New post for show ring gate.
- Poultry and Beef Barn electrical upgrades. At least one more outlet in poultry barn and one at the show ring clerk area. Juli will call for bids.
- Repair horse crows nest railing.

Rotate Sale Order Again? – Juli surveyed TRL, Westland Seed, and Julie Burns – they like it rotated. Valley Banks likes how we've done it in the past. Waiting for a few more call backs still.

New Business:

Awards - Awards committee will meet to finalize plan for the 2024 Fair.

Species Reports

Beef: Weigh-in went well, 20 steer members tagged in. A beef clinic will be held in June.

Horse: Meeting coming up on the 19th. We have lots of new horse leaders.

Poultry: Will work on project improvement plan and supplies needed. Possibly have a Fir & Feather Silent Auction during fair. Work on getting guidelines from Missoula and/or Bonner Counties.

Rabbit: Work on project improvement plan and supplies needed.

Sheep/Goat: Meeting in March for Quality Assurance/Project meeting. Then plan to meet monthly.

Swine: Quality Assurance/Project meeting scheduled for February 12th.
