

What is a Record Book?

- My 4-H Year, Non-Animal Project Journals, Animal Project Journals
- Record books must be up to date by July 1 for members to compete at the Marias Fair
- Shooting sports record books must be up to date to register for Marias Fair tournaments
- Can be:
 - Handwritten on paper forms
 - Typed on computer and printed


Assemble:

- My 4-H Year
- Non Animal project journals
- Animal project journals
- Project books
- Do not include:
 - Ribbons
 - Feed receipts
 - Newsletters
 - Interview sheets



What is a Project Book?

- Activities to help members learn about specific project
- Requirements
 - Complete 7 activities in each project book each year
 - Complete 5 lessons and 2 learning experiences OR 7 activities by July 1 to attend fair
- Record in front of book when activities were completed with the date


