# 4-H LOGO USE AND REQUIREMENTS - READ ME!

When referencing "4-H" in any document, club minutes, Facebook posting, poster, communication, t-shirt, etc. you MUST include the dash between the 4 and the H. The 4-H clover stem must point to the right. The clover cannot be tilted, flipped, distorted, or covered by text or another image. It must be 100% PMS 347 green – no shading or gradient of green.

Education is the basic job of County Extension Agents. As educators, they represent Montana State University Bozeman and the United States Department of Agriculture. Agents provide unbiased, research-based information, educational resources and outreach programs to youth and adults through the Land Grant University System. All help plan educational programs and provide informational support on the subject of their specialty. Call us with all of your questions! We love to hear from anyone in the county!

Sara Fluer – Family and Consumer Sciences Agent - offers programs aimed at providing education and resources relating to food and nutrition, health and wellness, and a wide range of family issues such as changing family structures, inter-generational relations; human response to stress and crisis; family laws, finance and economics; and decision-making.

**Anthony Sammartano – Horticulture Agent** - offers information and resources to individuals seeking guidance about home insect and pest control; fruit and vegetable garden care; landscaping and lawn maintenance; soil improvement and insect, disease and plant identification; and on-site consultations.

Francisco Gamboa Herrera – Agriculture Agent – answers livestock and cropping questions, identifies plants and

noxious weeds, providing recommendations and disease diagnosis. Provides service in Private Pesticide Applicator licensing and testing, forage nitrate and analysis testing, weed seed free hay certifications, water quality analysis and onsite consultations.

**Roni Baker – 4-H & Youth Agent** – facilitates youth hands-on projects in areas like health, science, agriculture and citizenship, in a positive environment where they receive guidance from adult mentors and are encouraged to take on proactive leadership roles.

# SHOOTING SPORTS MEMBERS & LEADERS GET SIGNED UP EARLY

4-H members should get signed up soon after ZSuite enrollment opens on October 1, in order to participate in the 2024-2025 4-H year shooting sports weekly workshops which start in November. Weekly archery, air pistol, air rifle, and BB gun workshops teach progressive learning, so it is vital to start on time. If you are not enrolled and approved in the project in ZSuite, you cannot attend the workshops. No exceptions.

All 4-H Shooting sports curriculum is only to be used by a 4-H member enrolled in a County Shooting Sport programs lead by a 4-H certified Shooting Sports leader. No Shooting Sports projects that involve firearms, air guns, or archery equipment may be taken independently without a certified leader.

To enroll in 4-H shooting sports, youth must be 9 years old on October 1 of the 2024-2025 year. The only exception is the BB Safety course which is open to those turning 8 years old by October 1 of the 2024-2025 year, and the Western Heritage Project requirements.

#### SHOOTING SPORTS LEADER TRAININGS FOR 2024-2025

To be a 4-H Shooting Sports Certified Leader in the State of Montana, the following must be satisfied:

1. Be at least 21 years of age. (BS/02/17/05)

- 2. Be enrolled as a leader in their respective County. Passed a background check and successfully completed the Montana 4-H Volunteer Training Modules.
- 3. All training attendees must complete the four National 4-H Shooting Sports modules in ZSuite to be certified at the end of the practicum day. The code for ZSuite will be shared with the leaders that sign up to take the trainings.
- 4. Be trained and certified in any discipline(s) that they are teaching at the county level.
- 5. Participants must attend the entire training and successfully complete all aspects to receive their respective discipline certification.
- 6. Certification is good for seven (7) years. If the discipline is not taught in the first 2 years, the course must be retaken.
