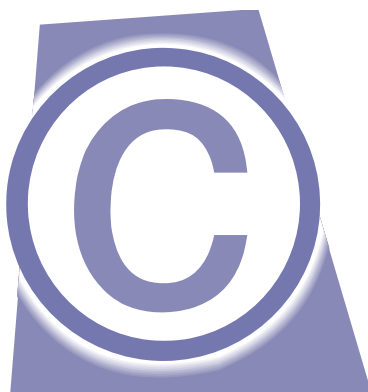

Copyright and Fair Use in the Classroom, Online, and in Publishing: Are You an **INFRINGER?**
