What you will need:

- 1 Cardboard Box
 - Look for the N.A. stamp
- 1 potato (certified seed potato) per hill
- 1 5 gallon bucket of compost or old manure
- 4 Slabs of Alfalfa Hay or Straw
- Plant Label
- Permanent Dark Marker
- Water (Rainwater no additives)

"Select a Location to Plant Your Potato"

Corners of your yard

Flower Bed

Lawn

Old Garden Spots

"When to plant?"

Plant your Potato for USDA growing zone 2-3 in mid April to 1st of May

Steps:

1. Dampen soil
2. Remove tape & stickers from your cardboard box
3. Get the cardboard wet
4. Lay the cardboard flat on the ground
5. Place the potato on the cardboard

Steps:

6. Pour the compost over your potato

7. Lay the alfalfa hay on top of the compost

8. Leave a small area in the center (for the potato to grow up through)

9. Wet everything



You are done! You have planted a no dig potato.



Keep moist

Remove hay in September, pick up
your potatoes.



Leave soil on the potatoes, place

in a dry location to harden for

10-14 days.

Store in cool dark location!



Wash off your potato,
when it is time to eat!
